The event will be held inside the Red Bluff Community Center, 1500 S. Jackson St. According to the Tehama County Sheriff's Office, the location will be open to people looking for additional resources and information on recovery from this terrible incident.

The LAC will be open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. from Aug.15-17.
