

## **Fire Safe Council gathering data on homeowner's insurance - Take the survey**

NEVADA CITY, Calif. March 15, 2017 - The Fire Safe Council of Nevada County (FSCNC) is participating in the State's Tree Mortality Task Force. Our local group is looking to gather data to make a case that insurance companies are not following state law when not renewing policies for lack of defensible space. "The California Department of Insurance says they haven't received complaints about non-renewal notices from insurance companies or the lack of options in the market for new policies," said Joanne Drummond, FSCNC's Executive Director. "I told them I hear it every day." Working with United Policyholders, a consumer advocacy group, FSCNC is encouraging everybody to take this survey [www.uphelp.org/survey](http://www.uphelp.org/survey) The survey data is confidential. The Task Force subgroup is also working with other counties - Mariposa, El Dorado, Placer, etc. - to send out this survey to gather data to demonstrate there is a problem in high wildfire hazard areas.
