Parents' options for insuring their kids, especially those with pre-existing conditions, have improved considerably in recent years, though more in some states than in others.

<u>An increasing number of states</u> are now requiring insurers to cover treatment related to Autism. In the <u>states that are implementing the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act</u>, children with pre-existing conditions <u>can no longer be denied coverage</u> when their parent buys a new health insurance policy. This protection will expand to both new and existing policies starting in 2014 if the U.S. Supreme Court upholds the Act.
