As CEO of Community Foundation Boulder County (CFBC), it is my distinct pleasure to write a letter of support for United Policyholders. CFBC has funded United Policyholders after two disasters in our community - the first in 2020, and the second beginning in 2021. In total, Community Foundation Boulder County has granted \$610,000 to United Policyholders, and consider this funding some of the best we have spent to aid recovery after the Calwood and Marshall Fires.

United Policyholders is an organization of experts and disaster survivors helping disaster survivors navigate the complex and often arduous insurance process after they have lost their homes. After the disasters in our community United Policyholders held numerous webinars to assist those rebuilding after disaster, as well as offering one-on-one help. After the Marshall Fire, CFBC and UP started a new program – giving legal support to survivors engaged in legal action against their insurance companies. After moving past the initial phase of fire recovery, United Policyholders took up the mantle to protect consumers from the insurance industry through state law and policy. CFBC was proud to support this work in addition to their direct work with fire survivors.

The Boulder County Wildfire Fund Advisory Committee repeatedly called United Policyholders “the best money we’ve spent” during the Marshall Fire recovery. The hard work and dedication displayed by United Policyholders compels me to highly recommend them as a support to any community affected by disaster.
